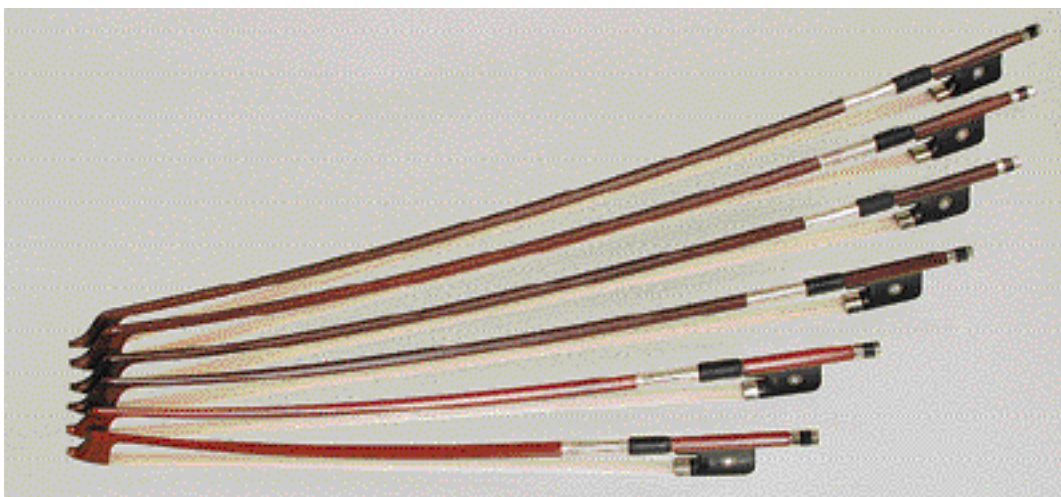


STUDENT BOWS - CELLO AND BASS



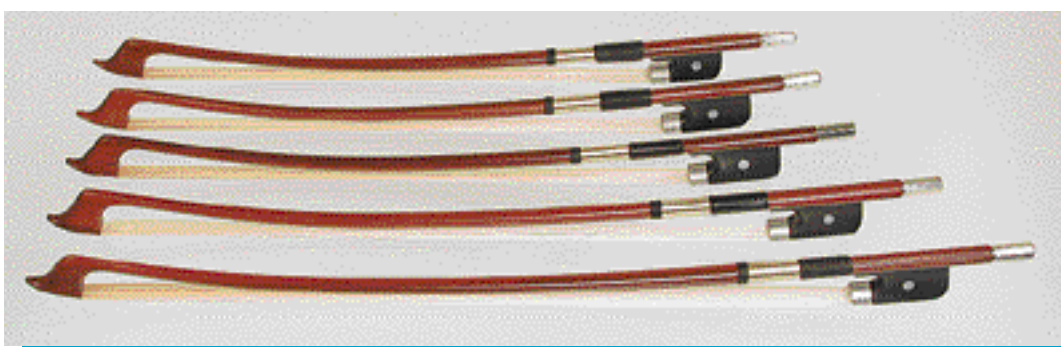
CELLO:

4/4:	67-71cm
3/4:	62-66cm
1/2:	57-61cm
1/4:	53-56cm
1/8:	45-52cm

N.B. The above dimensions are for guidance only and vary from different sources. They relate to overall length from tip to end of stick (excluding button).

Cello Bows

- 1189** Romanian, brazilwood stick, half mounted ebony frog
4/4, 3/4, 1/2, 1/4 sizes
- 1549** Good round wood stick, half mounted ebony frog
4/4, 3/4, 1/2, 1/4, 1/8, 1/10 sizes
- 1536** Strong round wood stick, full mounted ebony frog
4/4, 3/4, 1/2, 1/4, 1/8, 1/10 sizes
- 1266** Octagonal wood stick, full mounted ebony frog with Parisienne eye
4/4 size only



BASS:

4/4-3/4:	68-72cm
3/4-1/2:	62-67cm
1/2-1/4:	57-61cm
1/4-1/8:	55-56cm
1/8-1/10:	51-54cm

Double Bass Bows

- 1517** Romanian, brazilwood stick, ebony frog, five sizes:
(4/4-3/4), (3/4-1/2), (1/2-1/4), (1/4-1/8), (1/8-1/10)
- 1517G** Romanian, brazilwood stick, ebony frog, five sizes, German pattern
(4/4-3/4), (3/4-1/2), (1/2-1/4), (1/4-1/8), (1/8-1/10)
- 1237** Strong round wood stick, half mounted ebony frog, 3/4 size
- 1313** Student bow, strong wood stick, full mounted ebony frog with Parisienne eye,
3/4 size

Pernambuco (*Caesalpinia Echinata*) - indigenous to the Pernambuco (Aka Recife) area of Brazil. It is the finest wood for bow making. Its reddish colour and qualities stem from the minerals and sub-species found only in the Pernambuco region of Brazil, hence its name.

Brazilwood (*Caesalpinia Echinata*) is of the same botanical species and grows throughout Brazil. This variety gave its name to the country. It is greyish in colour and is used for student bows. Some Asian producers are describing this as black pernambuco.

Wood - Several other woods such as Kojicitzer and Yunxiang are now being successfully used for student and medium grade bows. These are selected according to availability and are described as wood bows.
